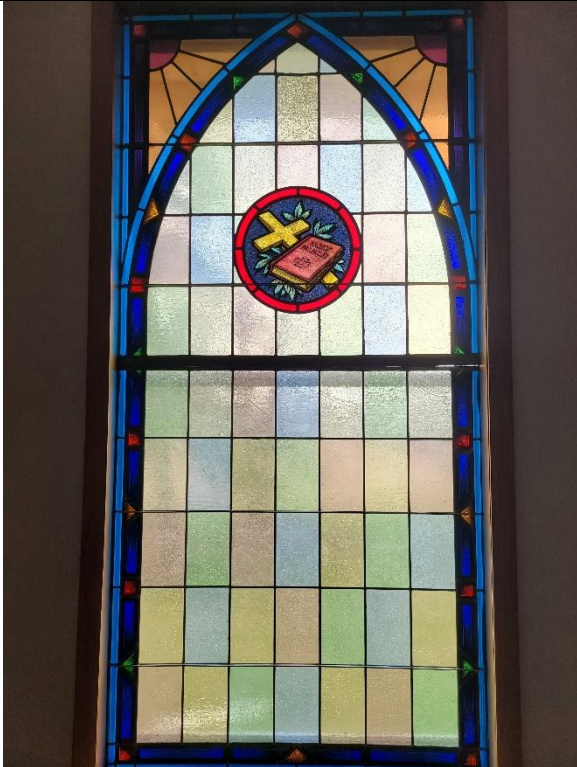


Grovenburg United Methodist Church Windows



Body Window #1 (Bible)

Approx. size is 39" x 82"

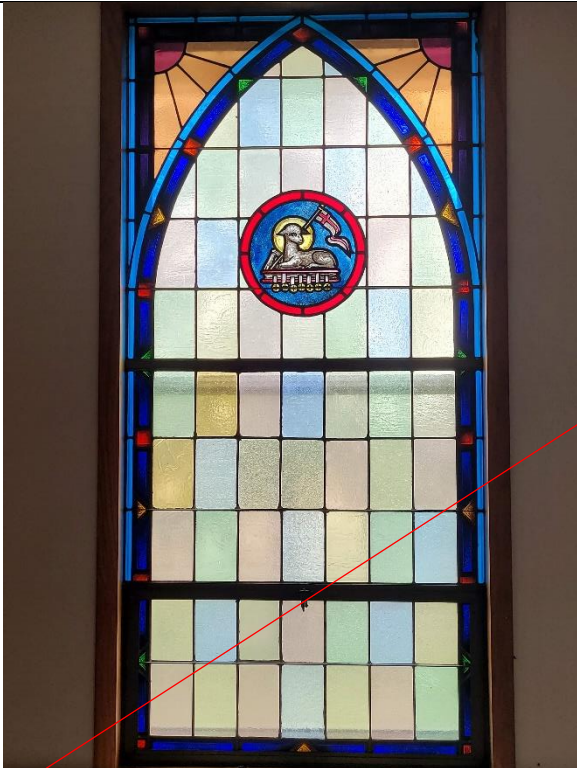
The "body" windows are among the oldest in the building and are believed to have been added as early as 1904. The history on the acquisition and installation of these windows originally is not known.

The "body" windows are among the oldest in the building and are believed to have been added as early as 1904. The history on the acquisition and installation of these windows originally is not known.

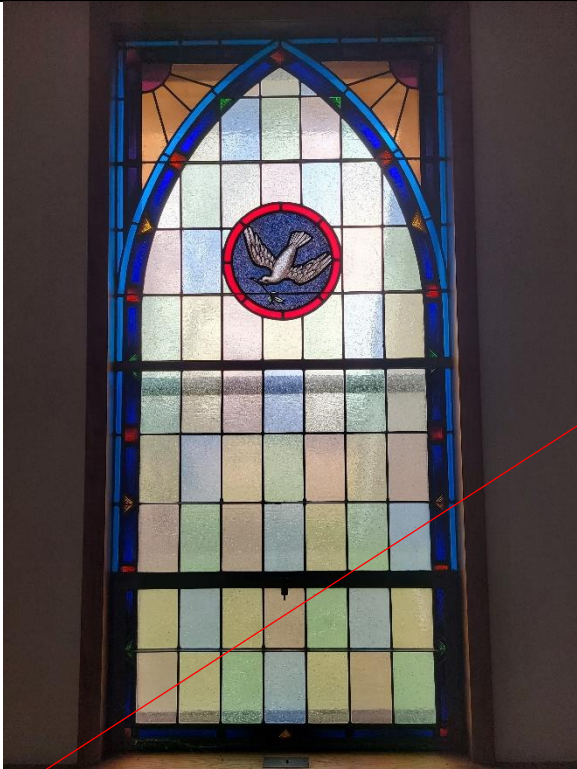
Plaque "In Memory of Barbara V. Gibson."

Good Shepherd Window

Approx. size is 40" x 54"

The window was likely commissioned and installed circa 1958, coinciding with this addition to the building and the death of Percy Barrett, to whom this window is dedicated.

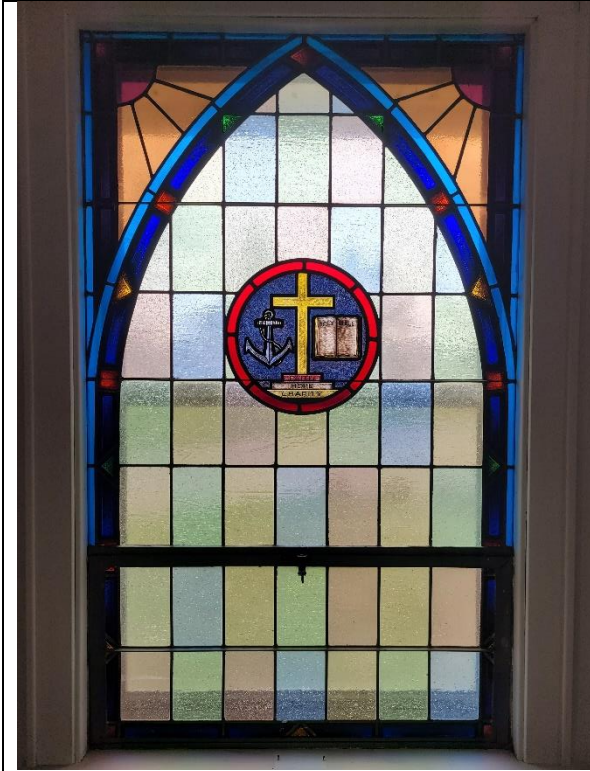
Plaque: "In Memory of Percy E. Barrett."

Reception Area Window #1 (Faith Hope Charity)

Approx. size is 39" x 65"

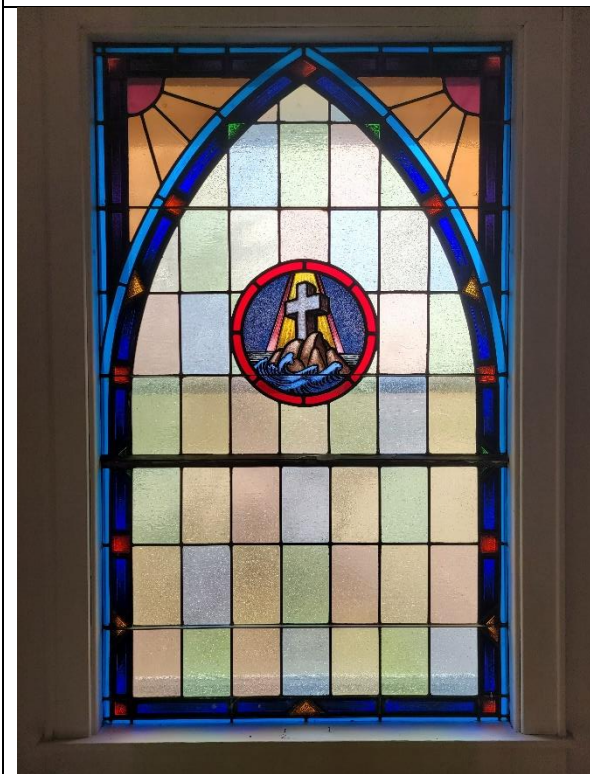
This window has a panel that opens on the bottom (shown here, the bottom two rows of colored rectangles).

Plaque: "In Memory of Gertrude A. Jarvis"

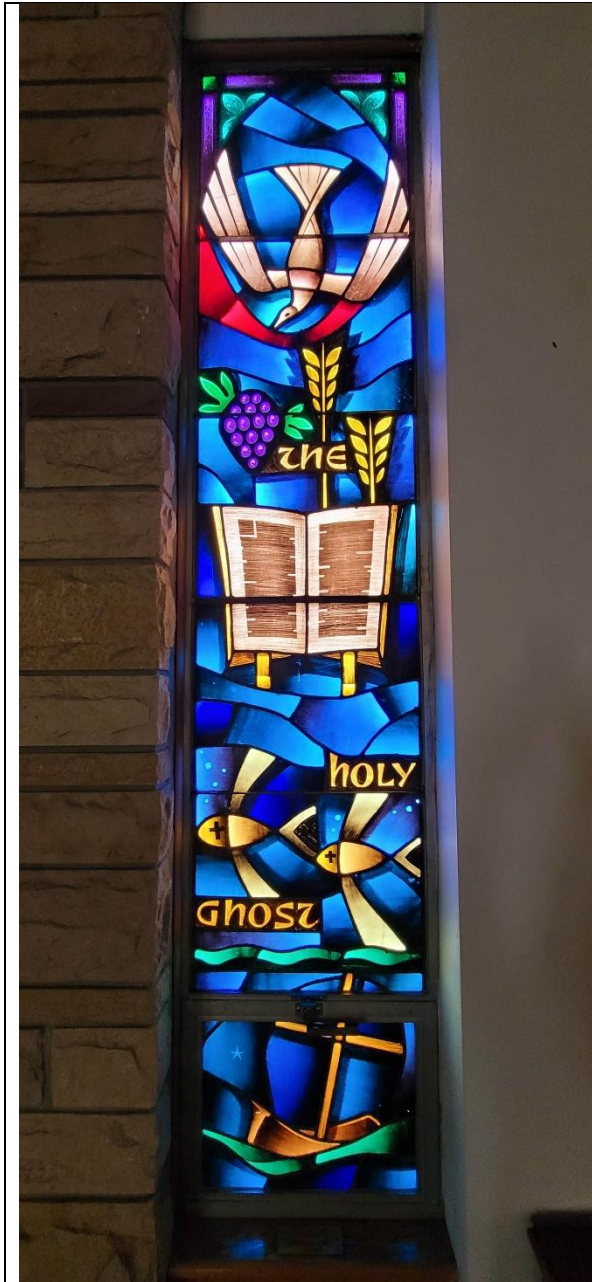
